

IIID Faculty Development Programs 2020

A report by **Radhika Viswanathan** Immediate Past Chairperson IIID-DRC & Member IIID Education Committee (2017-19)

n the past few months, we have been having a unique experience in our lives. The challenge has been to find new ways of understanding presence in a world of absence. It has been a time to reflect, to look within and transform the inner experience into a state of knowledge. It has been a period of anxiety, but also of immense possibilities that have helped us to stay inter-connected as we are essentially social

beings. While we seem to be connected, there is no doubt that we also face immense challenges as teachers. Education is not just assimilation of skills, and our endeavour has to be to bring together cognition & thought along with awakened sensory perceptions. Collaborative learning is important, more than ever before to reinforce social interaction which has been paused by the pandemic.

It is in this context that IIID launched the Faculty Development Program (FDP) for colleges that have collaborated with them. After several brainstorming sessions consisting of some of the members of the Managing Committee of IIID Delhi Regional Chapter and Acedge, Rajinder Puri, member of NEC & Chair Education committee and Tanuja Kanvinde IIID President-Elect & member Education Committee, a broad master plan of the program was prepared in two parts, spread over three days each. FDP-1 was designed to hone the subtle & intangible attributes while FDP-2 was to take care of the more quantifiable aspects of the program.

FDP1, held from 25-27 September 2020, was aimed at Building Sensitivities, Inspirations & Skills, making use of the inherent potential of online education to access resources. It was curated by Jeyanthi Nadesalingam, & Swanzal Kak Kapoor and powered by Team Acedge. Besides curating the program, Jeyanthi & Swanzal, along with Neeta Moudgil & Radhika Viswanathan anchored the three-day programme.

FDP2, planned from 9-11 October 2020, in quick succession to FDP1, was specially curated by Gita Balakrishnan and her energetic team at Acedge, with a focus on writing design briefs that could ensure holistic outcomes. The thrust was on the teaching-learning journey, beginning with the predesign process of writing the brief.

Sessions1 & 2 of FDP1 were about Building Sensitivities.

Swanzal Kak Kapoor introduced the participants to mindfulness, compassion, empathy and self-awareness through meditation, readings and exercises. There were readings from the writings of the Buddhist Monk Thich Naht Hahn and the Book Of Qualities by Ruth Gendler, followed by exercises that helped the group to centre themselves. She encouraged the group to maintain a journal to enable each one to create mind maps and reflect on their emotions on a daily basis.

The ice-breaking session by Nisha Rao was energizing, using words, gestures and sounds to express emotions & feelings. The issues she raised revolved around willingness to perform well and one's positive behaviour that followed as a consequence of that action. By asking the participants to think of an animal and liken one's qualities to that being, was an exercise which was aimed at recognising one's inner strength.

In Session 2, Mark Warner and Jeyanthi Nadesalingam were in conversation on teaching and learning. Mark spoke of Sri Aurobindo's teachings and a line that resonated with everyone was "You cannot teach a child unless you get the child's permission to learn". He shared his own experience on self-learning which was enriching. The participants were mesmerised by the session, which resulted in a set of lovely caricatures of Mark made during Tea time.

Jeyanthi spoke of the trapeze artist moment, the transition zones of our lives which are incredibly rich, where there is opportunity for things to happen if we believe that the process is more important than the solution.

Sessions 3,4 & 5 focussed on Building Inspirations.

Session 3 was a colour workshop, by Latika Khosla, during which she explained the NCS colour circle and Nuance Triangle. She spoke about dominant colours that identify the families of colour and the analysis of various nuances. The use of colour to describe a word was an interesting experiment and a glimpse into hues & proportions was a learning as well. Indicators like keeping in mind the project perspective, expressing it with words, and then using a colour palette steered by one's sensitivity to light, topology, materials and seasons were useful takeaways

In Session 4, Amrita Madan deliberated on turning challenges to opportunities and to set a new agenda for the future. Intense & stimulating, she used the words Reinvent & Incentivize as her mantra. She raised valid questions on whether we were teaching the worker bee or the average student. She believed that the focus should be shifted to peer learning by creating mentors and mentees of students. She quizzed the group on how they would instil the willingness to grow in the student. Her topic, Manifesto of growth of students, based on Bruce

Mau's beliefs provided several cues to move forward. One of them was to capture accidents and collect the wrong answers, which may sound confusing, but held deep meaning.


Session 5 was A New way of Seeing: Materials, Processes & Colour. The session began with Ayush Kasliwal's presentation on understanding materials and processes as a thought matrix, rather than a linear classification. Understanding material as what was immediately around you, right from the food you consumed was a thought-provoking suggestion. According to him, material classification could be based on inherent structure such as fibrous, crystalline, composite and resinous or on structural capabilities such as tensile strength, compressive, absorptive, torsional and composite. A memorable take-away from his conversation was 'Every material has its own mind, and one has to converse

The lively panel discussion that followed, with Ayush Kasliwal, Dharmesh Jadeja, Latika Khosla and moderated by Swanzal, explored ideas, intent and concerns around the selection of materials, processes and colour within the realm of interior design. There were a lot of ideas, reflections, thoughts and insights in the personal experiences that each of them shared.

While the slant of Sessions 1-6 was towards the immeasurable, Sessions 6, 7 & 8 titled 'Building Skills', settled to a few tangible interpretations, looking at Communication of ideas through mediums that are representative and meaningful.

In Session 6, Rohan Shivkumar, focussed on the styles of representation that could be used to communicate ideas to an audience. The exhibitions of Braj & Kohima, which he presented set a high standard for the multipronged manner in which the students understood the environment they studied, and finally showcased through exhibitions with drawings and models. It also showed how the design and control of the medium of communication could structure the way different actors participated in the process of understanding and development.

In Session 7, Avijit Mukul Kishore spoke about the ideas of the ideal Indian Citizen and the meanings of Indian Culture, which were important projects for the Indian State in the first few decades after India's independence.



The link for the film made by Mukul & Rohan, 'Nostalgia for the Future' had been shared with the participants in advance, which set the stage for an interactive discussion on it. A sensitively made film, it portrayed the dreams and ideals of a young nation, finally free of centuries of colonial rule. For the newbie Indian citizen, the state was the provider of employment and the home that came with it. The lives of ordinary people as well as the lives of the marginalised and vulnerable segment of society were embedded in the fabric of the film, raising thought provoking questions.

FDP1 concluded with Session 8. in which Arzu Mistry passionately discussed the development of a shared language and the use of creative processes to empower students to be the drivers of their own design practice. Through games and readings, she was able to hold the attention of the participants. Her accordion book was a fascinating system with pop-ups, pockets, extensions and flaps making it an aesthetic repository of notes and ideas located in the same place. The use of colour codes enabled one to access and track one's learning through this process, making the books a research journal, an idea, which one could use as a practice in one's life.

All three days ended with wrap up sessions called Realisations which gave the participants time to reflect on the day's sessions and the value it brought to their lives. They expressed their thought with words, doodles and sketches.

Day 1 of FDP 2 dealt with Designing the Brief. Amrita Madan, in her inimitable style, provoked the participants to look at the design studio with a different lens, using an inter-disciplinary approach. Experiential thinking as a thought process and inquirybased learning using the concept of whyhow laddering were trains of thought she followed. Several questions raised by her, such as, what would we want the learners to know, how would the learners learn and how would we know the learners have learnt, led to an animated discussion on learning objectives. Using the idea of Bloom's taxonomy, that prompted students to remember, understand, apply, analyse, evaluate and create, Amrita showed the possibility of finding answers to these questions in her engagement with the participants.

The ice break session on Critical Dimensions for Creative Learning for teachers & students, was held by Siddharth Singh. Creativity is seeing and doing as much as in feeling and knowing, was his conviction. If creativity was about bringing a lot of disparate things together, it had to be nurtured in a young

student and he deliberated about a process to develop individuality and unique methods for effective facilitation of care, curiosity and creativity. Using practical and fun exercises, Siddharth meandered his way through his session to explore abstraction and transformation.

Day 2 was on Design & Presentation. Ameya Athvankar looked at Exploding the brief by formulating and reformulating the design brief in the context of the overall design process. The film "Powers of Ten" was a stimulating start to his session, showing how important it is for designers to zoom in and zoom out while examining their own design iterations. He stressed on 'Design' being a playful conversation, which one should be mindful of, while imparting

education. He also emphasised that the ability to reframe design challenges is not only the core of design, but is also vital to the creation of innovative design outcomes. The acts of reframing by point of view and through provocation were taken up using

Day 3 focussed on Designing the Semester. Gita Balakrishnan, who conducted a Lecture & Demonstration felt replicating the way we worked in real life classrooms may not work in the online medium and we have to reinvent ourselves to inject liveliness & laughter in the class. She advocated that teachers should transform for online education, rather than transition into it using the same paradigms, which is the current scenario. Trends show that an approach based on blended learning, using both the real space and digital mediums would be the successful pattern of the future.


Maliha Sultan's session on Discussion and Assignment encouraged faculty to adopt approaches that foster holistic and integrated design solutions for students. Looking at curriculum and the integration of the various subjects was the thrust of the discussion. The idea of using open source ware as learning tools was a useful suggestion. Finally, she asked the pertinent guestion of where we draw our validation from, leading to the ensuing discussion on Awards, self, impact and peer approval.

Tanuja Kanvinde, on behalf of IIID, concluded the program by complimenting the teachers for being great learners and

reinforced the idea that since Interior Design is the fastest growing profession across the country / globe, there is a great onus on the Institutes and the faculty that impart this education. In fact, through the short period of 3-4 years of engagement with students, the attempt is to ignite their minds for a lifelong learning. Process is more important than the final product and an interdisciplinary approach is the way forward. Hence, pursuit of joint studios across design disciplines, vertical studios, along with engagement with craft of the region, documentation of vernacular etc. to be integrated with curriculum. Finally, that teaching is theatre - a lot of what is done is driven by passion and playing many roles such as teacher, friend & counsel.

Rajinder Puri thanked all who were part of framing the idea and designing the road map for conducting this Faculty Training Program. Both workshops were collaborative in nature sharing ideas between speakers/faculty and finally percolating to interior design students. The program also demonstrated the idea of teaching design using digital platform. Selected topics by speakers were varied and discussed overall teaching of design.

Both sessions, very sensitively curated by Swanzal Kak Kapoor, Jeyanthi Nadesalingam & Gita Balakrishnan and professionally managed by Acedge, were a resounding success with 42 participants from 21 Institutes. Interactive sessions generated a lot of discussions and exchange of ideas in the virtual platform, making up for the loss of physical meeting. It was indeed a program of substance, marked by the diversity of experience embedded in its curation, enriched by the incredible talent & generosity of the resource persons and driven by the energy of the participants.






Keat Ong


Parul Zaveri

To feel that we have license to imagine a future different from today - all we have to do is look back ten years, a hundred years, a thousand years - to realize how radically different things were then than now. The same would be true if we could look forward with the same clear sight. Since we know from our past that our future is bound to be different from our present, rather than waiting for it to happen on its own we have the power to give it form. 'Formgiving' takes you on a journey across time to sense how the world around us has been shaped from the past to the present and beyond - from the Big Bang to Singularity.




